

Patient Health Director

Purpose: To oversee and provide ZoeCare’s advanced medical care with compassion and excellence.

Description: The Patient Health Director provides medical direction and supervision for ZoeCare’s medical care beyond the scope of the nursing staff, writes prescriptions, and provides ongoing compassionate care to ZoeCare’s patients.

Reports To: Medical Director, Executive Director

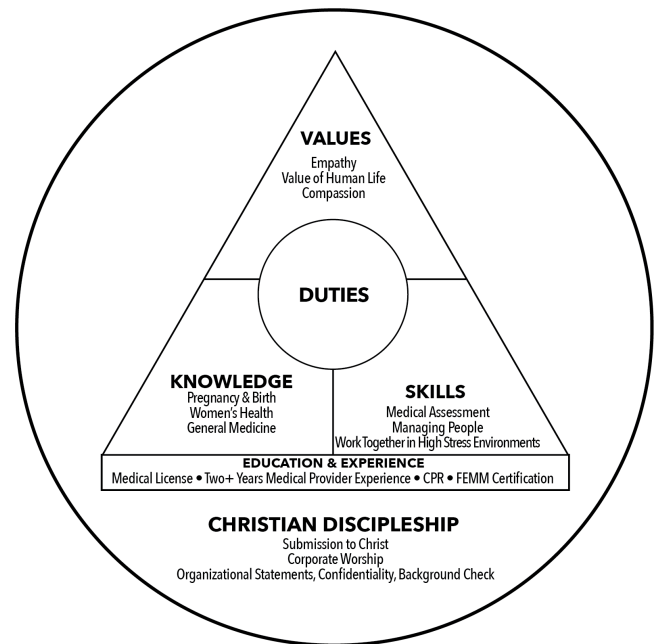
Supervises: Nurse Manager, Nurse

Weekly Hours: 8 - 12

Strategic Importance: The Patient Health Director provides needed care for the community, which brings in more patients to access ZoeCare’s services and extends ZoeCare’s ability to see patients for longer, making a bigger and lasting impact on their lives.

CORE COMPETENCIES
Patient Health Director

Duties:

- Provides professional supervision of ZoeCare’s patient health programs.
- Provides medical care to patients within the scope of ZoeCare’s services, which may include (among other things) women’s health (pap smears, breast exams, PCOS, colposcopies, etc.), prenatal care, postpartum mental health care, abortion pill reversal, and sports physicals.
- Conducts appointments for medical management for reproductive anomalies, as a part of a referral from CycleWise or within the community (requires FEMM training).
- Assists STI Clinic Director with conducting physical STI exams.
- Ensures that medical personnel adhere to professional standards of care and state/federal regulations regarding STI reporting.
- Writes prescriptions and refers patients to community resources.
- Provides on-call consultation for medical staff for client assessments, questions, or medical emergencies.

Knowledge:

- Pregnancy and birth, including prenatal, perinatal, and postnatal healthcare.
- Thorough knowledge of women's health issues.
- General OB/GYN medical knowledge.

Skills:

- Medical assessment, including risk assessment.
- Managing people and enforcing procedures.
- Ability to work effectively with others in a high stress environment.

Values:

- Empathy.
- Passion for the value of human life.
- Compassion for those in need.

Education & Experience:

- Be a licensed medical provider – medical doctor, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, or similar – with at least two years clinical experience.
- Be experienced in testing and treating sexually transmitted infections and diseases.
- Current CPR certification.
- FEMM certification (can be acquired after hire)
