

Welcome Home, Zoe!

t is exhilarating to be operating out of our own facility. Thanks to your generosity we are no longer at the mercy of a landlord but fully own the ZoeCare facility. A special THANKS to the Gianforte Family Foundation for the \$150,000 matching grant and a hearty thanks to all of our faithful donors who rose to the challenge and gave so generously to make this facility a reality. Thank You!

The original Capital Campaign raised \$300,000 for property acquisition. Our current facility at 2251 West Kagy was purchased in July 2014 for \$275,000. The balance of the original capital campaign was used to make the down payment on the remodel of the premises. Our architect, Lowell Springer fit a stupendous amount of utility into a limited space, enabling ZoeCare to meet the needs of the community for many years to come.

Our phase two capital call is for \$168,000 to pay off the debt acquired for the reconstruction and to provide a buffer for the facility maintenance. When the \$140,000 loan is retired, the monthly operating cost of the center drops over \$1,300. This is a significant reduction in the general operations costs required to continue our pregnancy testing and ultrasound services, STD testing, and educational and community outreach programs. We hope to reach this goal before the end of 2015.

Consider what this means to the lives saved through the work of ZoeCare. Once again we ask that you prayerfully consider pouring your financial gifts into this ministry for the purpose of getting ZoeCare out of debt!
