"I just care about babies": A five-year-old's quest

ou don't have to wait to make a difference. Joey Braaksma does not turn six until June, but age hasn't stopped him from raising over \$600 so, in his words, "more babies will live." On a Sunday morning at his church, he heard about the loss of unborn babies to abortion and ZoeCare's efforts to save them. He immediately tried to convince his mom Amy to allow him to sell coffee and donuts in his neighborhood. This past January, the two of them began selling at the end of their street in Churchill. They call their stand *Freezin' for a Reason*.

Joey is proud of the stand he made to advertise what he was selling. He drilled the holes, and painted "Donuts and Coffee for sale". On the first day, Joey sold out in two hours. He started selling a donut and coffee for 50¢, but he quickly discovered that no one wanted change! His customers ended up leaving \$5, \$10, or even \$20 bills for a donut and coffee. The neighborhood and community love what he is doing.

Amy thought that Joey would want to do this only once. After all, it was cold outside! She was wrong. He has sold coffee and donuts four times and to date has raised \$604 for ZoeCare. He has made it clear to his mom that they are going to do it again and again!

When asked what he wants people to know about him, he said, "I felt bad for them [the babies] so I decided I could give money so they could live. I just care about babies." It is very simple for him; he is selling donuts and coffee to help babies and their mothers.

Amy says God is using this in a much bigger way than she had ever envisioned. ZoeCare had not been on her radar, she confided, but her son had different ideas. Offering coffee and donuts with all proceeds going to ZoeCare has been a lot of fun for her and Joey to do together. It has been a joy for her to see her son's generous heart in action, and they have been able to visit with friends and neighbors they don't often get to see. She has had the joy of watching her five year old son learn that truly, "it is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

or so many of us, we remember middle school as a time when a romantic relationship consisted of passing notes to each other during class or maybe holding hands on the swings at recess. Unfortunately, that is not the reality for many junior high students today, even here in our own valley. Sexual activity and pornography have become pervasive among young people as our culture constantly presents distorted views of healthy relationships and sex. ZoeCare wants teens to hear a different message. Through our 45North program, we have been working hard sharing with students in both Gallatin and Park counties about how to avoid all risks involved with teen sex. We also empower adolescents to wait for sex and choose healthy relationships. Our teens today need to know that they are valuable and worth the wait.

This spring, the 45North program was taught in three public middle schools to nearly 400 students. We also

had the opportunity to talk to local church youth groups and present a four-week sermon series at Connect Church about love, dating and waiting.
