Welcome to ZoeCare

very day at ZoeCare is different, the patients who come to us for help are as varied as the struggles they face. The one consistent piece of our day is our time of devotions first thing in the morning, when we seek God and pray. Sometimes, a local pastor joins us to lead devotions. Then the work day begins...

The following scenarios are based on situations we have encountered but together do not represent one complete day. All the names below are not actual patient names. Our hope is that this glimpse into the situations we see each day will give you a greater perspective of the ministry of ZoeCare.

First appointment of the day is with a young woman named Eva. The appointment was scheduled by Rick, her boyfriend of six years who she lives with along with her three-year-old child. She did not want to come to the appointment but felt something nudging her to go. Rick was adamant that she get an abortion and threatened to kick her out if she did not. Eva spoke with the nurse and the patient advocate about her past abuse and trauma. She shared about the relationship with Rick and their ups and downs.

After getting to know who she is, the medical staff were able to discuss her options and how she was feeling. She never wanted an abortion. As they talked, Eva's resolve strengthened until she decisively determines she cannot end her child's life, regardless of Rick's threats. She knew she may become homeless but was willing to take that chance.

Meanwhile, Rick spoke with Mike, the Fathers Initiative Director. Even though he had a job and worked hard, he was financially distressed and did not feel he could provide for another child. Unbeknown to Eva and the medical staff in the other room, as the two talked, Rick was re-evaluating his stance on abortion. Mike provided him with several community resources to ease his financial stress. When their short time together was done, Rick signed up to be mentored in the being DAD program.

The nurse and patient advocate were able to encourage Eva to stand strong and give her some resources to help her after she left. They did an ultrasound to confirm the baby's heart rate and viability, to the delight of both Eva and Rick, who had their first glimpse of their new child. Eva has no other family support and knows there will be many bumps in the road ahead. The nurse and patient advocate prayed for Eva and Rick and they left ZoeCare feeling empowered to be parents of their new little one.

Next on the schedule was Patty, a very sweet teenage girl, and her boyfriend Kyle. They had been together for about 2 years. While Kyle talked with Mike, Patty opened up to the nurse and patient advocate.

PREGNANT IN A PANDEMIC

Patty was very mature for her young age. She had been a Christian for several years and was active in her church's youth group. She was so afraid of what the church was going to say about her being pregnant without being married that she felt abortion was her only choice.

Until she was faced with her unexpected pregnancy, Patty thought she was pro-life. She knows that abortion is wrong but felt it was the only way out of her shame and embarrassment. The staff shared the truth about abortion procedures and discussed adoption and parenting options. We encouraged her to overcome her fear by seeking counsel from her church leadership.

After the visit we reached out to Patty. She decided to keep her baby after considering her choices and expressed a plan to tell her parents. The friends she has shared with were supportive. Patty subsequently signed up for Sweet Cheeks, ZoeCare's free diaper program.

Kim arrived for testing for a sexual transmitted infection (STI). She avoided eye contact, was quiet and reserved. She shared that she had endured physical, emotional and sexual abuse as a child. As a young adult, she had also been in several abusive relationships. The latest one had just ended when her ex-boyfriend tested positive for an STI. The boyfriend had other sexual partners while dating Kim. She was heartbroken and needed time to share her feelings.

We listened, gently affirmed her and addressed her emotional and physical needs. We were able to pray with her, share God's truth, and encourage her to seek Him. Before leaving, she expressed how grateful she was for the care she had received.

It is our privilege to love them with the love of Jesus and to walk with them during the decision-making process and beyond. We have a great responsibility to share the light and hope of Christ to all the women and men who come through our doors By doing so, we help dispel some of the darkness that permeates their lives.
